


To begin, navigate to [www.Goolge.com](http://www.Goolge.com):



Then, enter in the name of the organization whose archives you wish to search:




On the “Results” screen, you will see a search field under the top result’s blurb.



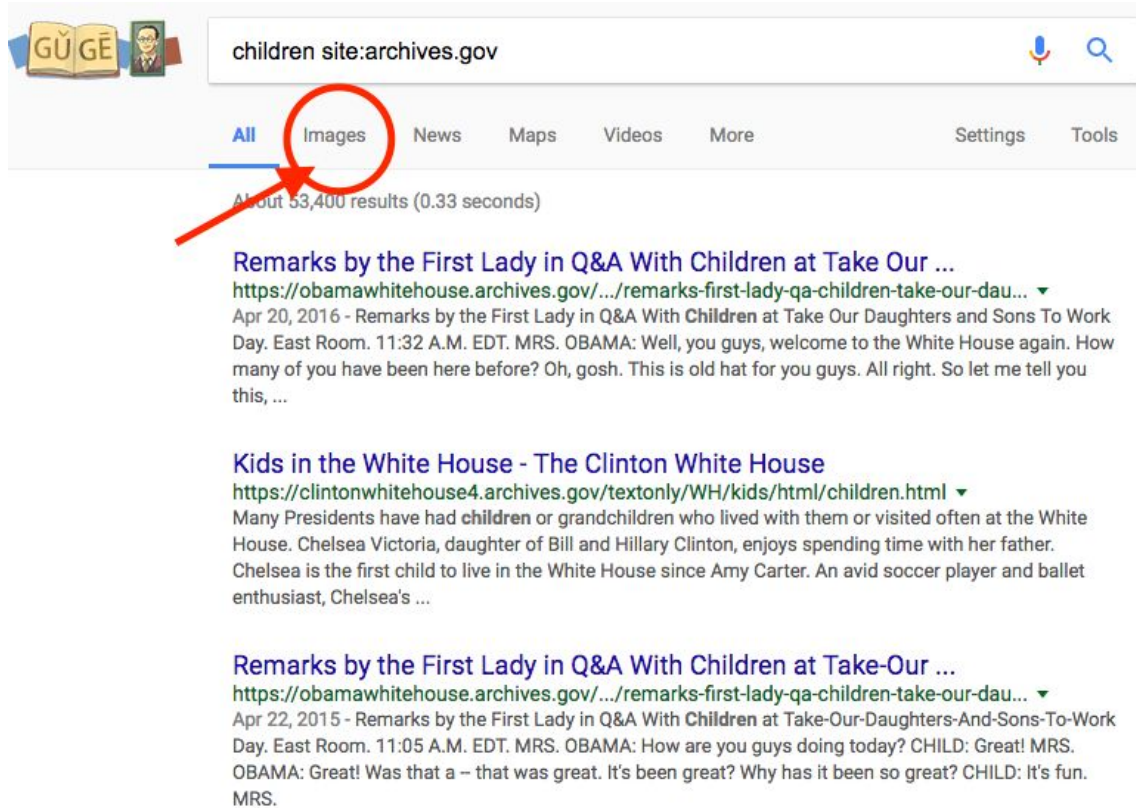

To narrow your search to **image** results, click on the word "Images" in gray beside the blue "All" option under the top search field:



The browser will now take you to your results. As you can see in the top search field, Google has scoured the organization's image database and returned results to you based on the related search tags:
